ORDINANCE NO. 2023-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, CASS COUNTY NEBRASKA, TO AMEND CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 3, SECTION 6-318: CONCEALED WEAPONS, TO COMPLY WITH NEBRASKA LEGISLATIVE BILL 77 (2023); TO PROVIDE FOR POSTING NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC THAT CARRYING OF FIREARMS IS NOT PERMITTED ON SPECIFIED MUNICIPAL PROPERTY; TO PROVIDE THAT THE CLERK AND THE APPROPRIATE DEPARTMENT, WHETHER ONE OR MORE, OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO IMPLEMENT THIS ORDINANCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF ANY SECTION, CLAUSE, OR PROVISION OR PORTION FOUND UNCONSTITUTIONAL OR INVALID; TO PROVIDE FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; TO PROVIDE THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE PUBLISHED WITHIN THE FIRST 15 DAYS AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND APPROVAL EITHER IN PAMPHLET FORM OR BY POSTING IN THREE PUBLIC PLACES IN THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, AND SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL, AND PUBLICATION, AS PROVIDED HEREIN; AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME AND BE MADE A PART OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, AND THE SECTIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE MAY BE RENUMBERED TO ACCOMPLISH SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, Nebraska Legislative Bill 77 (2023), has modified the requirements for carrying a concealed handgun or allowing municipalities to regulate the carrying of a concealed weapon, and

WHEREAS, said Legislative Bill does allow the entity in control of the place or premises to prohibit the carrying of a concealed handgun, and,

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, wishes to amend the Municipal Code to comply with Nebraska Legislative Bill 77 (2023), and designate areas, controlled by the Village, upon which firearms, including concealed handguns, shall not be carried, and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, deems the adoption of this Ordinance to be in the best interests of the citizens of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the findings herein above made should be and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance as fully as if set out at length herein.

2. That the Eagle Municipal Code, Chapter 6, Article 3, Section 6-318 shall be amended as foo

§6-318 CONCEALED HANDGUN PERMIT: CARRYING OF FIREARMS: PROHIBITED PLACES AND PREMISES.

- A. The Nebraska Concealed Handgun Permit Act (Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 69-2427 69-2447) provides that persons may carry concealed handguns pursuant to the provisions contained therein. The Municipality recognizes such rules, as they may be amended from time to time. However, The Municipality sets forth the following places and premises as locations persons, other than law enforcement officers, are prohibited from carrying a concealed handgun, even with or without a valid permit, or other firearms:
 - 1. Municipal Hall and Offices, and Parking Lot(s):
 - 2. Municipal Maintenance Facilities;
 - 3. Eagle Community Building; All Community Meeting Rooms leased or owned by the Municipality, whether meetings are in session or not;
 - 4. Municipal Parks and Swimming Pool;
 - 5. Municipal Wellsite; and
 - 6. Municipal Wastewater Facilities.
 - B. Any person in violation of this section shall be guilty of a Misdemeanor and subject to the penalties set forth in this chapter.
- 3. That the Clerk and the appropriate department of the Municipality are hereby authorized and directed to implement this Ordinance and post conspicuous notice that carrying a concealed handgun or other firearm is prohibited in or on the place or premises.
- 4. That should any section, paragraph, sentence or word of this Ordinance hereby adopted be declared for any reason be invalid, it is the intent of the governing body that it would have passed all other portions of this Ordinance independent of the elimination herefrom of any such portion as may be declared invalid.
- 5. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage, approval and publication of this Ordinance and in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
- 6. That this Ordinance shall be published within the first fifteen days after its passage and approval, in pamphlet form, and shall be in full force and take effect thereafter.
- 7. That it is the intention of the governing body, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Municipal Code of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, and the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

September 18, 2023

The Village Board of Trustees met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on September 18, 2023 with Todd, Hochstein, Meier, Caylor and Dobbins present. The Agenda items listed thereon were sufficiently descriptive to give the public reasonable notice of the matters to be considered at the meeting. The Chairperson, at the beginning of the meeting, informed the public about the location of the posted current copy of the Open Meetings Act. Chairperson Todd named the three (3) areas where the agenda was posted as follows: Eagle Municipal Building, Eagle Fire & Rescue Department and Eagle Municipal Park. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Chairperson Todd opened the public hearing at 7:00 p.m. for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to setting the final tax request. The Village of Eagle proposed to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate to be 0.618695 per \$100 of assessed value; this is the same tax rate as last year. The 2023-2024 property tax request is resolved to be set at \$536,153.54; this equates to \$375,307.91 for non-bond purposes and \$160,845.63 for bonds. Todd asked if there were any comments or questions from the public. There were no comments or questions from the public. The Village Board agreed to stand at ease until which time the next public hearing begins at 7:10 p.m.

The public hearing was closed at 7:10 p.m.

Chairperson Todd opened the public hearing at 7:10 p.m. for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the 2023-2024 Budget. Three copies of the proposed budget statement were made available to the public. Todd said any member of the public wishing to speak on the 2023-2024 Budget will be granted a period of five minutes each. The notice of public hearing on the 2023-2024 Budget was published in the September 14, 2023 edition of the Voice News and posted in the three public posting areas in town. Todd presented an outline of the key provisions of the proposed budget statement. The Village is keeping the tax levy the same as the prior year; with the valuation increase the Village can collect \$11,240.54 more tax in 2023-24 to help offset rising costs. The Village is budgeting for water and/or sewer infrastructure improvements; the estimated bond proceeds are \$2,500,000, the capital improvements are \$2,500,000 and the potential for debt payments is \$170,000. There are several other small projects budgeted for, but no other major projects included in the 2023-2024 budget. Todd asked if there were any comments or questions from the public. There were no comments or questions from the public.

The public hearing was closed at 7:12 p.m.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to introduce Resolution 2023-07. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Chairperson Todd read Resolution 2023-07 entitled:

RESOLUTION SETTING THE PROPERTY TAX REQUEST RESOLUTION NO. 2023-07

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1632 and 77-1633 provides that the Governing Body of the Village of Eagle passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the property tax request; and

WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Governing Body of the Village of Eagle resolves that:

1. The 2023-2024 property tax request be set at:

a. General Fund: \$375,307.91

b. Bond Fund: \$160,845.63

- 2. The total assessed value of property differs from last year's total assessed value by 2.14 percent.
- 3. The tax rate which would levy the same amount of property taxes as last year, when multiplied by the new total assessed value of property, would be 0.605724 per \$100 of assessed value.
- 4. The Village of Eagle proposes to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate to be 0.618695 per \$100 of assessed value.
- 5. Based on the proposed property tax request and changes in other revenue, the total operating budget of the Village of Eagle will increase from last year's budget by 3.1 percent.
- 6. A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk on or before October 15, 2023.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Caylor, to adopt Resolution 2023-07. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve a one-percent (1%) increase in Restricted Funds. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Caylor, to approve the 2023-2024 Budget. Voting: Ayes -5. Motion carried.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Caylor, to approve a supply reimbursement cost of \$500.00 to Eagle Fire & Rescue for Eagle Elementary Fire Awareness Day on October 13, 2023. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Open Forum – No public comment.

Motion by Todd, second by Hochstein, to approve Village staff participating in water and sewer continuing education webinars through the League of Nebraska Municipalities at a cost of \$60.00 per person. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve minutes as typed for the previous meeting. Voting: Ayes – Dobbins, Meier, Hochstein, Todd. Caylor abstained. Motion carried.

The Village Board of Trustees met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on September 18, 2023 with Todd, Hochstein, Meier, Caylor and Dobbins present. The Agenda items listed thereon were sufficiently descriptive to give the public reasonable notice of the matters to be considered at the meeting. The Chairperson, at the beginning of the meeting, informed the public about the location of the posted current copy of the Open Meetings Act. Chairperson Todd named the three (3) areas where the agenda was posted as follows: Eagle Municipal Building, Eagle Fire & Rescue Department and Eagle Municipal Park. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Chairperson Todd opened the public hearing at 7:00 p.m. for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to setting the final tax request. The Village of Eagle proposed to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate to be 0.618695 per \$100 of assessed value; this is the same tax rate as last year. The 2023-2024 property tax request is resolved to be set at \$536,153.54; this equates to \$375,307.91 for non-bond purposes and \$160,845.63 for bonds. Todd asked if there were any comments or questions from the public. There were no comments or questions from the public. The Village Board agreed to stand at ease until which time the next public hearing begins at 7:10 p.m.

The public hearing was closed at 7:10 p.m.

Chairperson Todd opened the public hearing at 7:10 p.m. for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the 2023-2024 Budget. Three copies of the proposed budget statement were made available to the public. Todd said any member of the public wishing to speak on the 2023-2024 Budget will be granted a period of five minutes each. The notice of public hearing on the 2023-2024 Budget was published in the September 14, 2023 edition of the Voice News and posted in the three public posting areas in town. Todd presented an outline of the key provisions of the proposed budget statement. The Village is keeping the tax levy the same as the prior year; with the valuation increase the Village can collect \$11,240.54 more tax in 2023-24 to help offset rising costs. The Village is budgeting for water and/or sewer infrastructure improvements; the estimated bond proceeds are \$2,500,000, the capital improvements are \$2,500,000 and the potential for debt payments is \$170,000. There are several other small projects budgeted for, but no other major projects included in the 2023-2024 budget. Todd asked if there were any comments or questions from the public. There were no comments or questions from the public.

The public hearing was closed at 7:12 p.m.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to introduce Resolution 2023-07. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Chairperson Todd read Resolution 2023-07 entitled:

RESOLUTION SETTING THE PROPERTY TAX REQUEST RESOLUTION NO. 2023-07

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1632 and 77-1633 provides that the Governing Body of the Village of Eagle passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the property tax request; and

WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Governing Body of the Village of Eagle resolves that:

1. The 2023-2024 property tax request be set at:

a. General Fund:

\$375,307.91

b. Bond Fund:

\$160,845.63

- 2. The total assessed value of property differs from last year's total assessed value by 2.14 percent.
- 3. The tax rate which would levy the same amount of property taxes as last year, when multiplied by the new total assessed value of property, would be 0.605724 per \$100 of assessed value.
- 4. The Village of Eagle proposes to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate to be 0.618695 per \$100 of assessed value.
- 5. Based on the proposed property tax request and changes in other revenue, the total operating budget of the Village of Eagle will increase from last year's budget by 3.1 percent.
- 6. A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk on or before October 15, 2023.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Caylor, to adopt Resolution 2023-07. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve a one-percent (1%) increase in Restricted Funds. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Caylor, to approve the 2023-2024 Budget. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Report from Fire & Rescue – Makinsey Lonergan (Rescue Captain) reported 10 rescue calls, 1 fire call, 2 car accidents and 1 mutual aid response since the August 21, 2023 board meeting. The department is averaging 11 volunteers per call.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Caylor, to approve a supply reimbursement cost of \$500.00 to Eagle Fire & Rescue for Eagle Elementary Fire Awareness Day on October 13, 2023. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Open Forum – No public comment.

Motion by Todd, second by Hochstein, to approve Village staff participating in water and sewer continuing education webinars through the League of Nebraska Municipalities at a cost of 60.00 per person. Voting: Ayes -5. Motion carried.

Report on Streets and Maintenance – Terry Caddy said the ditch at 3rd & E Street was cleaned and had a culvert replaced; the swimming pool was pumped out and winterization efforts are underway; the Frisbee Golf baskets have been installed and the truck fill building and park bathroom doors have been painted. Todd asked that the weeds at the Highway Shop be trimmed along the back fence.

Report on Wells and Sewer – Caddy said sludge was hauled from the WWTP; the west lift station pumps are beginning to plug up again; the regulator on the generator at the west lift station was replaced and a water leak at 3rd & F Street was repaired. Todd discussed the former well house building adjacent to Memorial Field and its poor condition. Caddy said the building needs to be demolished but the old water pipes need to be properly addressed first.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve minutes as typed for the previous meeting. Voting: Ayes – Dobbins, Meier, Hochstein, Todd. Caylor abstained. Motion carried.

Report from Committees and Boards – Caddy discussed the four CD's held at Riverstone Bank being moved to higher interest rate CD accounts. Todd said a QR code is being developed for the Frisbee Golf course layout. Dobbins discussed his progress troubleshooting the LED displays on the Monument Sign. Todd suggested a survey be sent to the swimming pool employees to share their opinions on how the season went. Caylor discussed the training room roof leak at the fire station. Todd discussed the monthly emergency siren tests.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:44 p.m.
