The Agenda items listed thereon were sufficiently descriptive to give the public reasonable notice of the matters to be considered at the meeting. The Chairperson, at the beginning of the meeting, informed the public about the location of the posted current copy of the Open Meetings Act. Chairperson Todd named the three (3) areas where the agenda was posted as follows: Eagle Municipal Building, Eagle Fire & Rescue Department and Eagle Municipal Park. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Open Forum – No public comment.

Motion by Meier, second by Surman, to approve the Special Designated License (SDL) Application for McIntosh Ventures located at 540 S. 4th Street for June 21, 2025 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. the following day. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Todd, second by Hochstein, to approve Eagle Park & Recreation's request of \$100.00 for signage and plants for the Community Garden. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve Eagle Park & Recreation's request to host three pool parties during the 2025 season pending date availability. Voting: Ayes – Dobbins, Meier, Hochstein, Todd. Nays – Surman. Motion carried.

Motion by Surman, second by Meier, to approve Application for Payment No. 2 to Wright Sewer & Water, LLC in the amount of \$13,050.42 as part of the 6th Street Water Main Extension Project. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve the transfer of \$25,000 from the General Fund to the Park Fund for the 2025 pool season. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Surman, second by Meier, to approve minutes as typed for the previous meeting. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

The Chairperson, at the beginning of the meeting, informed the public about the location of the posted current copy of the Open Meetings Act. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Report from Fire & Rescue – Makinsey Lonergan (Rescue Captain) reported 8 rescue calls, 3 fire calls and 1 motor vehicle accident since the April 21, 2025 board meeting. Training with pool employees will be held this Friday.

Discuss/possible action: Updates on the potential for a new Fire & Rescue Station – No updates available at this time. No action taken.

Open Forum – No public comment.

Motion by Meier, second by Surman, to approve the Special Designated License (SDL) Application for McIntosh Ventures located at 540 S. 4th Street for June 21, 2025 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. the following day. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Discuss/possible action: Approve Eagle Park & Recreation's request for signage and plants for the Community Garden – Elizabeth Umshler (Chairperson; Eagle Parks & Rec) was present and said the commission is seeking \$100.00 in total for a sign and plants. Surman asked if this is something the Village will typically pay for or if it is something the community members will handle themselves. Umshler said last year she covered the plant expenses and this year she is asking for a contribution from the Village.

Motion by Todd, second by Hochstein, to approve Eagle Park & Recreation's request of \$100.00 for signage and plants for the Community Garden. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Discuss/possible action: Approve Eagle Park & Recreation's request to host three pool parties during the 2025 season – Umshler said the commission is interested in hosting two pool parties for children and one pool party for adults this year. Todd expressed concern with scheduling these pool parties on Friday or Saturday nights when the public is more apt to seek out these dates for private parties. Umshler agreed and said the commission is flexible and willing to utilize available weeknights.

Hochstein expressed concern with alcohol consumption during an adult pool party. Surman expressed concern with expanding the request to three pool parties.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve Eagle Park & Recreation's request to host three pool parties during the 2025 season pending date availability. Voting: Ayes – Dobbins, Meier, Hochstein, Todd. Nays – Surman. Motion carried.

Motion by Surman, second by Meier, to approve Application for Payment No. 2 to Wright Sewer & Water, LLC in the amount of \$13,050.42 as part of the 6th Street Water Main Extension Project. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve the transfer of \$25,000 from the General Fund to the Park Fund for the 2025 pool season. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Report on Streets and Maintenance – Terry Caddy said Hein Construction will begin the process of crack sealing streets this week. The main pump at the pool is currently running; however, an electrical issue that has yet to be identified continues to shut it off on a regular basis. The G Street Mill & Overlay Project was discussed with the Village Engineer last week and will be advertised for bids beginning next week.

Report on Wells and Sewer – Caddy said the Sewer Committee met with the Village Engineer last week to discuss possible future expansion. Hochstein requested well readings and draw down results over the course of the last few years for comparison purposes.

Motion by Surman, second by Meier, to approve minutes as typed for the previous meeting. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Report from Committees and Boards – The Eagle Planning Commission will meet on May 29, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. to discuss the potential for a new Fire & Rescue Station and the conversion of the existing station into a Community Center.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:24 p.m.
